

## **Dr. Keith Scott-Mumby Lecture Topics**

### **“Surprising Ways That Foods Can Really Hurt You”**

Here I make it clear with telling examples that:

- Foods can be quite toxic.
- Each person reacts to different foods (therefore no set diets)
- The diseases and symptoms which result can be complex, baffling and variable (protean)
- The especially disastrous effects are on the brain (behavior, perception and moods)
- Each person has to discover their own “hostile” or bandit foods.
- I explain how this is done in quite some detail.

### **“Cancer Alternatives – What Are Your Choices?”**

Here the main premise is that we are *all* battling cancer (statistically 1 in 2 men and almost 1 in 2 women will get cancer. That means for every couple, one will likely get cancer). So it affects everybody.

Main points are:

- You don't have to choose between conventional and alternative. It's fine to do both.
- Chemo and radiation doesn't have such good results. I show beyond the “massaged” figures put out by the money organization.
- There are 3 important approaches: diet, psychology and chemical clean up.
- Diet is without question the number one defence and treatment, yet MDs ignore it (I quote volumes of science on how important this is).
- I reveal and discuss a whole range of therapeutic possibilities, for and against, such as oxygen therapies, enzyme therapies, herbs, hyperthermia and more. These treatments are furiously contested by the medical industry here in the US but as a knowledgeable doctor with an international education I can state clearly these are all being used reliably and successfully by ethical doctors (MDs) in numerous countries around the world.

### **“The Birth of Energy Medicine in the West”**

Many uninformed people today think of energy medicine as Chinese or Ayurvedic or “hands on healing”. I dismiss this myth quickly by introducing cutting edge science showing that energy is the key to disease, using modern advanced physics. The energy medicine I explain in this talk is based on Western electromagnetic technological brilliance, not esoteric mysticism. I coined the term “Virtual Medicine” for this domain and that was the title for a keynote book.
